Dear friends & supporters,

Being outside in nature is pure joy. As members of Mass Audubon, we hope you find your joy at our wildlife sanctuaries throughout the year—watching a Red-tailed Hawk soar overhead while walking the trails at Pleasant Valley in Lenox, hearing the sweet sounds of a White-throated Sparrow during a Wednesday Morning Bird Walk at Joppa Flats in Newburyport, or experiencing the benefits of the new All Persons Trail at Long Pasture Wildlife Sanctuary in Barnstable. Our 110 protected wildlife sanctuaries not only bring joy to people they also protect our world by absorbing carbon, protecting water and air, providing habitat for wildlife, and so much more.

As you read this Annual Report, you will see the exceptional progress we have made toward our ambitious Action Agenda. You will note the increased pace and scale of our work to protect nature for wildlife and people because the triple crisis of climate change, loss of biodiversity, and inequitable access to nature demand it. The 30x30 Catalyst Fund, a \$75 million private fund created and launched last year, helped us quadruple the rate of our land conservation efforts, while inspiring others to think and act at a scale necessary to protect 30 percent of our land and waters by 2030. That goal is in sight.

Conserving land and opening new wildlife sanctuaries are critical steps to meeting our biodiversity and climate goals, but we also need to avoid losses to nature. Mass Audubon's science-based clean energy and nature advocacy campaign led to the passage of state climate legislation this past fall. The new law creates incentives to develop solar on built up areas, while discouraging development on our most precious forests. What was extraordinary was how fast this moved from a research paper completed with Harvard Forest to a law that avoids forest loss.

Mass Audubon's ecological restoration team, formed just three years ago, has already restored more than 1,400 acres of land, including wetlands, shorelines, streams, and cranberry bogs. They are now busy restoring an additional 5,000 acres of land to meet our goal of 7,500 acres by 2029.

While we take every step and action we can to protect the natural world, our commitment to ensuring people have access to it has never been stronger. We opened our first urban wildlife sanctuary in 25 years—Pawtucket Farm Wildlife Sanctuary in Lowell. This partnership-based sanctuary serves a community that ranks near the bottom of cities with access to parks and open spaces. We built four new



All Persons Trails (APTs) and we are on track to reach our goal of opening 25 APTs by 2026. Last year, 20 percent of our camper families—2,000 campers in all—took advantage of our sliding scale scholarship program creating economic equity and access to our world class nature summer camps.

We are very proud of the work we have done this past year to protect the nature of Massachusetts, and we're excited for the year ahead working to tackle the greatest conservation challenges of our time with hope, urgency, and action.

Thank you for being a part of Mass Audubon. We couldn't do this without you!



The 30x30 Catalyst Fund A Year of Impact & Growth

In November 2023, a transformational gift from MathWorks allowed us to seed our \$75 million 30x30 Catalyst Fund, created to protect and restore the Commonwealth's most valuable natural lands and meet ambitious statewide land conservation goals.

Over the course of the last year, this fund has more than lived up to its name.

Upon receipt of the first portion of MathWorks' \$25 million donation, Mass Audubon immediately focused on more than 1,300 forested acres in Winchendon and Ashburnham that were under agreement to a developer who planned a utility-scale solar development. The towns had a right of first refusal, so we worked with local partners to persuade elected officials in each town to assign their rights to Mass Audubon. We then used the Catalyst Fund to purchase the land in anticipation of transferring it to a combination of state agencies for permanent protection and stewardship.

Immediately following that initial victory, Mass Audubon got to work elsewhere in the state. Working with several partners, we protected more than 800 acres of critical watershed land in Barre. This project, the Hawes Hill Conservation Corridor, comprises conservation restrictions on eight properties that provide important wildlife habitat and connect thousands of acres of adjacent protected land.

We followed that up by providing acquisition funds and a loan enabling the Town of Mendon and the local land trust to protect a key 116-acre tract that had long been a land conservation priority. We were also able to add a 156-acre parcel in the upper headwaters of the Millers River to our Cheshire Pond Wildlife Sanctuary, protecting high-value habitat including prime forest, stream corridor, and a vernal pool. The ready availability of the Catalyst Fund enabled us to respond quickly when the landowner placed the property on the market, and to complete

the acquisition within a very short time frame.

All of this work is being noticed.

In October 2024, Mass Audubon was selected for a \$25 million grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to work with conservation partners to protect and restore 10,000 acres of carbon-rich and biodiverse forests and wetlands in the Connecticut River Watershed. Mass Audubon and its partners will work with landowners to restore forest habitat by removing dams, reestablishing floodplain forests, and engaging in other practices that strengthen our forests.

This partnership with the USDA is a testament to the land protection work we carried out in 2024 and the confidence we're inspiring to achieve our ambitious 30x30 strategy—protecting 30 percent of Massachusetts land by 2030. It's also precisely the kind of public-private partnership we sought to leverage when we launched the 30x30 Catalyst Fund.

Over the last year, the generosity of Mass Audubon supporters has propelled our 30x30 Catalyst Fund to more than \$40 million toward our \$75 million goal, enabling us to accelerate the pace of land conservation. Currently, we have 20 projects underway totaling 18,000 acres. The momentum behind our 30x30 strategy is palpable—and with your continued support, we anticipate making great progress in 2025!

Launching Conservation Careers

at Mass Audubon and Beyond

When we launched the Environmental Fellowship Program (EFP) in 2022, our goal was to provide early career opportunities for young professionals with identities that have been historically underrepresented in the environmental and conservation fields.

Through the 14-month fellowship, fellows gained handson experience within a Mass Audubon department, built professional connections in the environmental field, and acquired needed tools as they embark upon their careers.

While the third cohort is underway, alums from the first two cohorts have proven the power of this program. Past fellows have landed everywhere from the Harvard Geospatial Library to the Conservation Law Foundation to the Connecticut Land Conservation Council. And five of the 11 alums stayed on with Mass Audubon, serving various roles throughout the organization.

One such is Amara Chittenden, a member of the first cohort and currently Community Engagement Coordinator in Boston. "As a fellow in conservation science, I am grateful to have had so many different experiences that continue to shape my love for nature—from nesting birds on coastal islands to salt marsh vegetation, database and project management, and so much more," Chittenden said. "It is crucial that the early careers program is supported—not only to lower barriers to entry in the environmental field, but to ensure that fellows continue to be heard, mentored, celebrated, and promoted for years to come."

In addition to the EFP, Mass Audubon's other early career program, Massachusetts Climate Corps (MCC), offers college students an eight-week summer internship. This past summer, six interns from five colleges attended professional development workshops and conducted research related to climate resilience.

The culmination of both the EFP and MCC took place in August at the Early Career Programs Symposium. Here, the fellows and interns presented their findings and personal projects to Mass Audubon staff and members of our board, providing invaluable presentation and networking skills that will continue to serve all the alums for years to come.

A Community-Focused Restoration Project

At New England's largest urban wildlife sanctuary, Broad Meadow Brook in Worcester, the focus has long been on ensuring the city's community not only feels welcome on the 435 acres, but also that it belongs. So when the time came to begin a multiyear, multimillion-dollar ecological restoration project on the severely degraded 40-acre wetland in the sanctuary's northern section, community involvement became a central element of the plan.

The Broad Meadow Brook restoration project intends to enhance the health and resilience of this wetland by improving water quality, increasing flood storage capacity, and strengthening native wildlife habitat value. All of this may, in turn, reduce flood risk in adjacent residential neighborhoods, including environmental justice communities, and enhance recreational access to the area.

Mass Audubon can't do this work alone; our partners for this project include the City of Worcester, the Blackstone Watershed Collaborative, and the Massachusetts Division of Ecological Restoration. Team members have actively elevated the voices of the sanctuary's neighbors and visitors via community listening sessions as well as a survey distributed in five languages. By engaging the local community, we can share the importance of restoring wetlands and waterways like Broad Meadow Brook.

Over the next year, the project partners and community members will advance the restoration designs for the site, continue monitoring seasonal changes, and continue working with the local community.

Climate and Nature Champions Score Big Wins

With an updated name and expanded focus, Mass Audubon's Climate and Nature Champions initiative served up major wins for wildlife this past year.

We've provided new opportunities to get involved, and more than 6,500 people have raised their hands and spoken up in support of our policy agenda.

Grassroots advocates rallied together to enact state regulations to ban the harvest of horseshoe crabs during their breeding and egg-laying season. More than 2,600 Mass Audubon supporters submitted written public comments, and more than 70 attended in-person public hearings. The Marine Fisheries Advisory Commission heard their voices and voted overwhelmingly on March 19 to approve the proposed protections, helping the horseshoe crab population towards recovery.

Our campaign to Rescue Raptors, which supports grassroots organizations seeking to reduce second-generation anticoagulant rodenticides (SGARs) in their communities, has also taken off. These poisons pose a devastating risk to birds, mammals,

and even pets. Once a rodent eats the poison, its body slows down, making for an easy but toxic meal for predators and scavengers. So far more than 50 local and regional campaigns have organized, and at least nine—including Boston's—have successfully helped reduce the use of SGARs in their communities. We will continue to support these and new campaigns, with the ultimate hope of driving statewide change.

Over the next year, we'll engage our Climate and Nature Champions on even more advocacy campaigns, including driving more state funding toward protecting land, siting solar and clean energy infrastructure responsibly, and improving wetlands regulations.

Successfully Advocating for the Value of Nature

In the race to reach net zero by 2050, Massachusetts needs to take bold action on several fronts, including rapidly scaling up clean energy. But how and where we site solar and other clean energy projects matters for nature and biodiversity. With solar developers deploying hundreds of large ground-mount projects in pristine tracts of carbon-rich and biodiverse forest and productive farmland, Mass Audubon knew we needed to do something and do it fast.

We partnered with Harvard Forest and expert energy modelers to tackle the question:
Can Massachusetts deploy solar energy fast enough and at a scale that reaches the state's decarbonization goals and timelines, while minimizing the harm to our most ecologically important lands? Months and months of in-depth research and analysis culminated in the October 2023 report Growing Solar, Protecting Nature.

This groundbreaking study showed that continuing with our current, haphazard approach to siting solar exacts too high a price on natural and working lands. And it proved that a path forward that protects nature is possible, while still enabling for scaling up new, affordable solar in communities across the state.

It was this seminal work that earned Mass Audubon a seat at the table on Governor Maura Healey's commission on energy infrastructure and permitting. Joining Mass Audubon on the commission were energy developers and utilities, consumer advocates, environmental justice representatives, state agencies, and key energy legislators from the state House and Senate. With Mass Audubon's expertise on the commission, many of our

recommendations to elevate the role of natural and working lands in decisions about siting clean energy made it into legislation.

After months of steadfast lobbying by Mass Audubon and climate, energy, and environmental justice advocates, the Act promoting a clean energy grid, advancing equity and protecting ratepayers became law in December. This law is critical in that, for the first time, Massachusetts has a framework for valuing the benefits of carbon-rich and biodiverse lands when determining where energy projects get sited.

Also remarkable was the speed at which this effort came to pass. Rarely, if ever, does legislation go from concept to passage in such a short period of time.

We still need to advocate more to shape how the new law is implemented. Over the next year, we'll push for strong criteria to define suitable sites for new solar projects and to ensure that cities and towns have a meaningful role and resources to permit responsibly sited projects.

This advocacy win shows just how much power Mass Audubon can wield when we develop innovative research, collaborate with partners, rally our members, and negotiate with legislators. And we are just getting started. It is more urgent than ever that we fight for sound, science-based policies that protect the nature and wildlife that we not only love, but that we need.

Sanctuaries Shine

Across the state, our wildlife sanctuaries welcomed more than 600,000 visitors to its trails, programs, and events.

At the same time, sanctuary staff were hard at work, restoring landscapes, training volunteers, and making our properties welcoming to everyone. Here's just a snapshot of the amazing progress made this past year. More than 400 volunteers at 16 wildlife sanctuaries lent a hand during Statewide Volunteer Day on April 27. Projects included constructing turtle gardens for Diamondback Terrapin nesting on the Cape to clearing almost 100 pounds of trash and debris from salt marshes on the North Shore.


Nature-themed festivals brought in crowds of folks (many for the first time!) looking for a way to spend time outdoors with their friends and families. From enjoying a pint while listening to local tunes during a Flocktober at Ipswich River in Topsfield to celebrating Pride at Magazine Beach Park Nature Center in Cambridge to cooking up some s'mores while searching for owls at Felix Neck in Edgartown, there was something for everyone.

The ribbon was cut on three new All Persons Trails at Cedar Pond in Wenham, Brewster's Woods in Concord, and Long Pasture in Barnstable. And at Pleasant Valley in Lenox, the All Persons Trail reopened after it suffered severe damage during a microburst in 2021.

Fiscal Year 2024 Highlights

Mass Audubon had a tremendously strong year financially. In FY 2024, we raised just over \$70 million in total for operating support and initiatives that drive our Action Agenda forward and mobilize remarkable progress in our climate, biodiversity, access, and advocacy goals. This is an all-time high for Mass Audubon and comes at a time when we are accelerating the scale and pace of our work in the face of considerable threat to nature and climate.

We are deeply grateful to our supporters for sharing our urgency and ambition, for believing in this organization's ability to deliver on this agenda, and for continuing to recognize the enormous importance of connecting people to nature. In addition, investment income from our endowment exceeded budget and was at an all-time high due to diligent portfolio management and higher interest rates. Realized bequests contributed to the health of our endowments for the long term.

Looking ahead, we will continue to make strategic investments in nature that accelerate progress, scale impactful programs, and continue to build the long-term health of Mass Audubon. We will do it with the same thoughtful financial management that has been a hallmark of Mass Audubon for more than 128 years.






